

### Revisit / review

*Recapping previously taught vocabulary, key words and learning*

### Teach

*Introducing new vocabulary and learning*

### Practice

*Speaking and listening; interaction and role play*

### Apply/Consolidate

*Independent task to consolidate*

Powerpoint

Interactive games.

Speaking and listening.

Teach new vocabulary through PowerPoint.

If appropriate teach the French phonemes.

Listen carefully to pronunciation.

Use new vocabulary in speaking paying attention to correct pronunciation.

Miming games; Karaoke songs; interactive games; role play.

If appropriate to focus of lesson, practise reading aloud new phonemes and through interactive games.

Independent tasks which will vary depending on focus of lesson.

Writing tasks, posters, leaflets, menus etc. which will enable independent focus and consolidation.

Demonstrate understanding through speaking and listening activity.

### **What will French Look Like in the Classroom:**

- There could be a display of key words/unit specific vocabulary
- If key words/vocabulary are unable to be displayed a knowledge organiser/ key vocabulary mat should be available
- Children will have lots of opportunities to take part in speaking and listening activities, including role play
- Children will be able to discuss and reflect on their learning, sharing it on Seesaw

### **Assessment and Monitoring Progress**

**Assessment:** Language Angels provides self-assessment charts which children can complete; there are also grids for teacher assessment to be completed at the end of a unit. This enables children's progress to be monitored.
